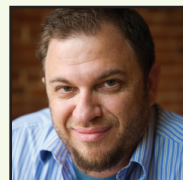

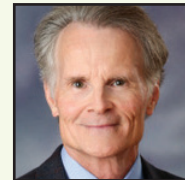

BALLOT ISSUE 1: COLLECTIVE BARGAINING FOR ALL UNIFORMED FIRE DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES

The HBA opposes Issue 1 and endorses the No on #1 campaign led by Mayor Suthers and the Chamber. More than 52% of the City budget is fire and police, and a long-term plan is in place in regards to staffing and equipping our public-safety professionals. Firefighter compensation and benefits meets or exceeds other fire departments in similar sized communities.

Collective bargaining will turn a historically collaborative relationship into a contentious negotiation between the city and an "exclusive bargaining agent." The responsibility of budget allocation should not be delegated to unelected persons who advocate exclusively for one group of employees, and impasses will lead to costly special elections paid for by the City's taxpayers.
